02 JANUARY 1852

Police Magistrates Court

Thomas HURST, ticket of leave, drunk and disorderly, fined 5/- and costs.

09 JANUARY 1852

Police Magistrates Court

**Perth:**

30<sup>th</sup> John NEWTON, ticket of leave holder, interfering with the Police in the execution of their duty; 10/- and costs

5<sup>th</sup> John CARROL, ticket of leave holder, absconding from his employer and entering service of another. Ordered back to original employer.

6<sup>th</sup> Joseph ISOM, ticket of leave holder, absenting himself from his employment; 2 days wages and costs, and return to employment.

16 JANUARY 1852

Police Magistrates Court

**Perth:**

9<sup>th</sup> John CARROL, ticket of leave holder, absconding from his employment and entering service of another. Return to the Establishment.

11<sup>th</sup> John PATTERSON, ticket of leave holder, drunk and using threatening language to his master; 5/-, costs and caution to behave better in future.

23 JANUARY 1852

Police Magistrates Court

19<sup>th</sup> Pauley JACQUES, ticket of leave holder, quarrelling and creating a disturbance in the street and assaulting a policeman; 10/- and costs.

20<sup>th</sup> Michael DELANEY, ticket of leave holder, attempting to rob Mr DEVENISH's till. Prisoners excuse for drawing the till from its place was, "that he wished to take a pattern from the knob forming the handle, to see if he could make one like it".

21<sup>st</sup> John BRYNE, a Parkhurst lad, stealing grapes. 3 months hard labour.

06 FEBRUARY 1852

Police Magistrates Court

26<sup>th</sup> Thomas GLENNAN, ticket of leave holder, found sleeping on the premises of Mr G HAYSOM; cautioned and dismissed.

27<sup>th</sup> Charles SMITH, a Parkhurst boy, loitering about the back of Mr G STONE's premises at about 5 o'clock in the morning. 1 month hard labour.

29<sup>th</sup> Mr VON BIBRA was summoned to answer complaint of G PHIPPS, ticket of leave holder, with respect to wages. Judgement in favour of latter.

3<sup>rd</sup> Alfred TEDDEMAN, ticket of leave holder, breaking into the house of John RICHARDS, boot and shoemaker, Murray Street on the evening of the 2<sup>nd</sup> ultimo; dismissed, prisoner paying expenses of 6/6.

2<sup>nd</sup> Henry GRAY, appeared to answer complaint of John BONSOR, ticket of leave holder, in Mr Gray's employment. BONSOR complained the clay furnished him to make bricks was not a proper consistency, being too soft. Mr Gray and his foreman proved quite the contrary, it being, if anything too stiff. This being the third time that BONSOR made groundless and frivolous reports, he was ordered to the Establishment at Fremantle.

13 FEBRUARY 1852

Police Magistrates Court

**Perth:**

7<sup>th</sup> Joseph LINAN, Parkhurst lad, charged with breaking into the house of John WILLIAMS on the evening of the 6<sup>th</sup> ins. Fined 10/- for being drunk.

9<sup>th</sup> John MASON, ticket of leave holder, charged with stealing fruit from garden of Stephen HYDE. 1 month hard labour.

11<sup>th</sup> George RICHARDSON, ticket of leave holder, given in charge by Mr BIBRA, was

discharged, no prosecutor appearing.

Murdoch McGLENSHIE and Robert DAWES, both ticket of leave holders, fined 5/- and 3/- costs for being drunk in street.

Andrew ROBERTSON and Henry LEE, both ticket of leave holders, fined 5/- for bathing in the river at half past three in the afternoon.

**Fremantle:**

9<sup>th</sup> W DOBIEAN, ticket of leave holder, drunk and in Fremantle without pass. 5/- and costs for being drunk and 5/- for being in Fremantle without pass.

Thomas HEYBAM, drunk and in Fremantle without pass; 5/- and costs for being drunk, 5/- for being in Fremantle without pass or in default of payment 7 days imprisonment.

20 FEBRUARY 1852

Police Magistrates Court

**Perth:**

13<sup>th</sup> Simon GULLIVER and J PAWLEY, ticket of leave holders belonging to District of Guildford, found in Perth without pass on the 12<sup>th</sup> inst.; dismissed with caution.

16<sup>th</sup> William DAVIS, ticket of leave holder, drunk in Court on the 14<sup>th</sup> inst. 5/- and 3/- costs.

**Fremantle:**

A ticket of leave man named PRICE was brought before the Court, charged with having stolen a mattress from the Mt Eliza Depot in August last. Case adjourned until Wednesday.

27 FEBRUARY 1852

Police Magistrates Court

**Perth:**

18<sup>th</sup> A McCORMICK, ticket of leave holder belonging to Freshwater Bay Station, absent without leave. 1 months gaol.

20<sup>th</sup> J SCREECH, ticket of leave holder, stealing a waistcoat from the store of Mr TURNER of Perth. 12 months hard labour and 50 lashes.

23<sup>rd</sup> J PREEMER, ticket of leave holder, indecently assaulting Miss Eleanor DONNELLY in Adelaide Terrace on the night of the 20<sup>th</sup> inst. 3 months.

25<sup>th</sup> J SALISBURY, ticket of leave holder, drunk in streets, 5/- and 3/- costs.

26<sup>th</sup> Thomas TAYLOR, ticket of leave holder, drunk and creating disturbance in a cottage off Murray Street at about 10pm on 25<sup>th</sup> inst. And violently resisting police. 5/- and 3/- costs.

**Fremantle:**

18<sup>th</sup> Charles WILSON, ticket of leave holder, charged with being in Fremantle without pass. 5/-

19<sup>th</sup> T HIGHAM, ticket of leave holder, drunk and disorderly, without pass. Ticket of Leave forfeited for 3 months.

20<sup>th</sup> R HOLDER, ticket of leave holder, drunk and disorderly. 5/- and costs.

23<sup>rd</sup> William DOUBECAN, ticket of leave holder, leaving Fremantle District without pass. 2 months

27 FEBRUARY 1852

Fatal Accident.

William SYDENHAM, ticket of leave holder, drowned off Bluff Point on western side of freshwater Bay. Pensioner CAMPBELL, attempted to save him but also drowned. Account of accident is given. See also, the paper of 5th March.

05 MARCH 1852

Police Magistrates Court

**Perth:**

4<sup>th</sup> W SMITH, ticket of leave holder, drunk and neglecting his master's business; 1 month hard labour.

**Fremantle:**

27<sup>th</sup> J BUTCHER, ticket of leave holder, in Fremantle without pass; 5/-

28<sup>th</sup> W SHEEN, ticket of leave holder, charged with leaving his employer and drinking at a public house; 2<sup>nd</sup> offence; 1 month

John NEWTON, ticket of leave holder, drunk and disorderly; 5/- and costs and admonishment.

J REW, ticket of leave holder, drunk and disorderly; 5/- and costs.

19 MARCH 1852

Police Magistrates Court

**Perth:**

12<sup>th</sup> James SWEENEY, ticket of leave holder, drunk and exposing his person in the street; 5/- and 3/- costs

13<sup>th</sup> W DAVIS and J POLLARD, the former a ticket of leave holder, drunk; 5/- and 3/- costs.

26 MARCH 1852

Police Magistrates Court

**Perth:**

19<sup>th</sup> William KIRKHAM, ticket of leave holder, drunk in streets; 5/- and 3/- costs.

22<sup>nd</sup> Gordon DAVIDSON, ticket of leave holder, carrying fire arms without permission; remanded.

William DAVIES, ticket of leave holder, drunk in streets; 2<sup>nd</sup> offence; 10/- and 3/- costs.

**Guildford:**

Joseph PARKER, attached to the depot in this town, charged with being drunk on the night of 14<sup>th</sup> inst.; 5/- and caution to refrain in future.

Thomas BRADFIELD, ticket of leave holder, drunk on Sunday night; 5/- and expenses.

02 APRIL 1852

Police Magistrates Court

**Perth:**

26<sup>th</sup> Frederic WARD, ticket of leave holder, loitering about the town, in no employment; was directed to get employment immediately or be returned to the Establishment.

John CUMMINGS and James GREENAWAY, absconding from their master, Mr BICKLEY's employment. Prisoners complained of their food and treatment, but the Magistrate gave them some good advice and ordered them to be taken back by mounted policemen.

**Bunbury:**

26<sup>th</sup> James BLAIR, ticket of leave man, using improper language to overseer, and being imprudent to the assistant superintendent; 1 month hard labour.

16 APRIL 1852

An inquest was held yesterday morning at the Colonial Hospital on the body of a ticket of leave holder man who died on Wednesday evening at Yates' public house. From the evidence it appeared that the man went to Yates', drank a glass of rum, laid down and died, as Dr Galbraith stated, from the effects of intoxication.
